Biography of Rav Mordechai Willig, shlita

Rabbi Mordechai I. Willig is the Av Beth Din of the Beth Din of America. He also serves as the Rabbi Dr. Sol Roth Professor of Talmud and Contemporary Halachah and Segan Rosh Kollel of the Bella and Harry Wexner Kollel Elyon, Kollel L'Horah Yadin Yadin, at the Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Theological Seminary of Yeshiva University. Since 1974, Rabbi Willig has been the rabbi of the Young Israel of Riverdale in Riverdale, New York. He is the author of the four volumes Am Mordechai series. He has written many articles in Torah scholarship journals. He was appointed as Rosh Yeshiva at the Mazer School of Talmudic studies at Yeshiva University. He is the Chairman of the Vaad Halachah of the National Council of Young Israel. He conducts a monthly conference call with Young Israel rabbanim to answer shailos they are encountering in the field. Rabbanim ask practical halacha and hashkafa questions from all four chelkei Shulchan Aruch and Rabbi Willig prepares responses assiduously.

Biography of Rabbi Dr. Aaron Glatt, MD

Rabbi Aaron E. Glatt, MD is the Associate Rabbi at the Young Israel of Woodmere. He has been giving a Daf Yomi shiur for over 30 years (available on YUTorah) and gives a weekly

gemara be'iyun shiur, daily halacha shiurim including a daily on-line Dirshu Mishnah Brurah Yomi shiur (all 6 volumes are available online at OUTorah or on a data stick from the OU). An international lecturer on medical and halachic issues, Rabbi Dr. Glatt has authored two seforim through ArtScroll: *Visiting the Sick* and *Women in the Talmud* and is the Director of the Medical Halacha Commission of the Rabbinical Alliance of America. Rabbi Dr. Glatt has been recognized by Jewish communities throughout the world for his expertise in navigating Covid.

Board certified in Internal Medicine and Infectious Diseases, Rabbi Dr. Glatt is Chairman of Medicine and Chief of Infectious Diseases / Hospital Epidemiologist at Mount Sinai South Nassau, and a full Professor of Medicine at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai. A spokesperson for the Infectious Diseases Society of America, he recently received the prestigious 2020 NY American College of Physicians Laureate Award, was named a Master of the American College of Physicians and was the recipient of a CDC's Center for Global Health's Excellence in Partnership Award.

Biography of Rabbi David Keehn- Rav Dovid Yitzchok, zt"l, ben Akiva Yehuda, yb"l

Rabbi David Keehn, 54, was known to all as the chaplain of Queens. Rabbi Keehn left an indelible mark on young and old, lecturing to school children and helping the hospital-bound for 23 years at New York-Presbyterian Queens (Booth Memorial) as their Jewish chaplain and director of pastoral care, and as the hospital rabbi at NYU Langone's Manhattan campus since 2017. Although legally blind, Rabbi Keehn overcame hurdles to be the light and guide to so many. Rabbi Keehn was known to help families during their time of need, ministering to patients, families, and staff across the Jewish spectrum, and to people of all faiths. He developed relationships with the leading rabbis in the community as well as with clergy. Rabbi Keehn was dedicated to Congregation Ahavas Yisrael, the Young Israel of Kew Garden Hills, Vaad Harabonim of Queens and was deeply involved in many community groups, including serving on the Queens Community Council, where he was a former president and vice president, and a member of the Rabbinical Council of America Chaplaincy Commission, and a member of the Rabbinical Alliance of America Chaplaincy Commission. Rabbi Keehn was the recipient of the prestigious Rabbinical Council of America Healthcare Chaplain of the Year award received at the RCA conference in 2019. He was sought upon for his advice from many fellow rabbis. Chaplains of diverse faiths sought his advice and expertise, and he was respected and looked upon as a wonderful role model. The impact he made on all fronts is still felt today as is his loss for humanity. He was truly a good will ambassador with whom men, women and children of all ages could relate to from all backgrounds. He was truly an ambassador of Hashem and of Klal Yisrael.
